

Kia ora,

Our whakatauki encourages us to share our gifts and our tamariki have definitely excelled over the past week sharing theirs.

Thursday last week 8 of our year 5 and 6 students went to Maidstone Intermediate in Upper Hutt to compete against schools from the wider Wellington region in the EPro8 semi-finals. Although they didn't progress to the finals both teams achieved well and should be very proud of themselves. They learned lots and are looking forward to competing again next year. Well done: Alfredton Lambingtons Hadley, Otto, Rupert and Marshall 200 points, 7th place and Alfredton Engineers Sid, Leo, Kade and Sophie 180 points, 11th Place.

Yesterday it was Rural Schools Athletics. Every child tried their hardest and everyone enjoyed the day. Only children aged 8 and above can go to Bush Athletics tomorrow. Out of 23 eligible children 15 have qualified. This is a fabulous achievement. Well done to James, George, Jorja, Nellie, Olive, Marshall, Tutamou, Rupert, Sophie, Otto, Emily, Hadley, Kade, Harvey and Tova.

Thank you to parents who helped at both of these events. Your support is greatly appreciated.

On Tuesday we hosted a REAP Rural Kids Day for children in Years 5 to 8 from 6 local schools. We had 72 children on site along with adults from Wairarapa REAP and the schools. The children enjoyed getting to know each other as well as tackling tent building, cooking bush kai, bush first aid and taking on a navigation challenge. A touch rugby game at lunchtime also proved very popular. There are similar events planned for next year which will be hosted by one of the rural schools.

Please can all children make sure that they have brought their decorated shoebox to school by Monday. Christmas crafts will be made throughout the next 2 weeks.

Tararua Community Services have asked that instead of making shoeboxes of gifts we simply donate items for them to distribute. These should not be wrapped and can be food or gift items. They have sent an email thanking our community in advance for our donations. Please can any donations be brought to school before the 10th of December. These will then be given to families in our local area by Tararua Community Services.

A reminder that any outstanding stationery invoices and sports subs for 2024 should be paid by tomorrow please.

Laura is still looking for a few volunteers to help out at the Agrikids event for Huia children next Thursday. Thank you to those who have volunteered already. If anyone else is free please contact Laura as soon as possible.

As you will have seen in the news, as well as in previous newsletters, schools will be teaching the refreshed curriculum in Maths and English from 2025. As part of the changes staff have been undertaking training in structured literacy with Learning Matters (iDeal). Mrs Bond and Mrs McKay have almost completed their PLD and Miss Mabey and myself will begin ours next year. We are conscious that teachers taking time out of class can be disruptive for some children so 2 out of the 3 days will take place during the school holiday in late January. The third day will be in early February. All of our children will be having structured literacy lessons in class from the start of term 1 2025. These lessons will initially focus on phonics - sounds and spelling as well as reading words and grammar. Many of the children will already be familiar with aspects of what they will be learning.

Jane has resigned as our librarian as she has exciting plans for 2025. We therefore need a new librarian. We are looking for someone to work one morning per week, term time. Ideally we can find someone before Jane leaves so that she can show them what is required. If you are interested please contact me as soon as possible.

BirdCare Aotearoa is NZ's largest wild bird hospital and rehabilitation centre. Our special charity provides life-saving care to around 6,000 rescued wild birds each year, including endangered native and endemic taonga species. It is currently baby bird season, and we urgently need to raise enough funds to cover the significant cost of the specialised care required for raising the thousands of orphaned and injured baby birds we receive in our dedicated nurseries during summertime.

As part of our current fundraising campaign, we have launched 'Move for Good', a peer fundraiser encouraging people of all ages to get out into nature for an event or activity (e.g. running, swimming, cycling, trampolining or bushwalking) or a fun outdoor adventure activity (e.g. Birdie Bingo shown on our website) and invite friends and family to join or sponsor their challenge, to raise funds to help our hospital continue saving rescued baby birds, and become a wild bird champion.

All champions who complete their challenge will receive an eco-friendly, locally-crafted medal, and the school with the most champions will win a Rimu trophy.




