Kia ora,

This is our penultimate newsletter of 2024. We have a very busy end of term ahead of us.

On Monday the Board will meet at 5.30pm. 2025 is a Board election year so now is a perfect time to come along to a Board meeting and see what we do. We meet 9 times a year; if you can't make this meeting please come to one early in 2025. Being on the Board is a great way to be more involved in your child's school and to have your say in the governance going forward. Anyone is welcome to attend our Board meetings and we would love to see you there.

Last Friday 14 of our children took part in Bush athletics. Congratulations to Harvey Tohiariki (3rd in 11 year old boys discus), Olive McKay (3rd in 9 year old girls long jump) and Nellie Blundell (2nd 100m and 3rd 200m 8 year old girls).

Next Wednesday we will be having a Christmas party. Each family will be receiving a request for a shared plate of food. Please look out for the note which will be coming home this week. For example: if you are asked to send chippies / snacks please send enough for about 15 children. We have shared out the food items so that we have enough for a shared lunch for the school. The party will end in time for the children to go home by bus as normal.

On Thursday 12th, starting at 6pm, it will be Christmas Tree night and prize giving. This will be held in the hall. Every child is expected to attend, children should be there no later than 5.55pm. The event will end with a visit from a very special gentleman. This is a time for our school families to gather to celebrate the end of a successful school year. We look forward to seeing parents and grandparents as well as the children on this evening.

All children will be bringing home their books, equipment and Christmas box etc during the week. They will all need a couple of bags to carry things. Please can they bring these to school on Monday. Reports and the Year Book (one per family) will go home towards the end of the week.

Friday the 13th December is our final day of school. Over the holiday a new fence is being put up. The old fencing will be available to anyone in our community who would like it. The fencers will let me know when it can be collected and I will pass this on to you once I hear.

The pool will be available for use from the 14th December. We are currently in the process of changing the entry code. You can contact the school office from Tuesday 11th December if you would like to use the pool over the summer. When you use the pool we ask that you record in a book, which will be near the door, the date you are there and how many people get into the pool. We are required to note how many bathers we have each day.

The school library is now closed. If your child still has library books they must be returned to school before the end of this week as we will be carrying out a stock take next week.

If you are able to donate a new toy or an item of food which can be taken to Tararua Community Services for their Christmas appeal please send the item to school tomorrow or Friday. There is a box in the admin area for all donations.

We still have a few families who are yet to pay for their child's stationery. Payment needs to be made by the end of the week as we need to complete our financials before the end of term.

Tomorrow, Huia class will be taking part in their Agrikids day. A couple of the activities will be taking place outside. All children will need to bring a waterproof as it is forecast to rain. The

event will go ahead as farming doesn't stop when it rains. Thank you to the parents who are helping at the event.

BirdCare Aotearoa is NZ's largest wild bird hospital and rehabilitation centre. Our special charity provides life-saving care to around 6,000 rescued wild birds each year, including endangered native and endemic taonga species. It is currently baby bird season, and we urgently need to raise enough funds to cover the significant cost of the specialised care required for raising the thousands of orphaned and injured baby birds we receive in our dedicated nurseries during summertime.

As part of our current fundraising campaign, we have launched 'Move for Good', a peer fundraiser encouraging people of all ages to get out into nature for an event or activity (e.g. running, swimming, cycling, trampolining or bushwalking) or a fun outdoor adventure activity (e.g. Birdie Bingo shown on our website) and invite friends and family to join or sponsor their challenge, to raise funds to help our hospital continue saving rescued baby birds, and become a wild bird champion.

All champions who complete their challenge will receive an eco-friendly, locally-crafted medal, and the school with the most champions will win a Rimu trophy.
