Kia ora,

Welcome back to school. We are all very excited to see everyone back having had a really great holiday. Please read the whole of this newsletter carefully as there is a lot of important information contained within it. As it is the first one of the year every family will receive a paper copy. It will also be available on the school website and Facebook page.

As you will notice, our Native Garden is looking fantastic. This is down to the hard work of Pip Edmonds who tirelessly looked after the garden all 2024. Her work is very much appreciated.

Please can all children bring a named hat and a full water bottle to school each day. This is very important as the weather is hot and the children get very thirsty.

Swimming will take place each Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. All children will need togs and a towel in a bag, plus goggles if they wear them. Thank you to Emma Moody who will be teaching swimming again this year.

Whilst we are swimming, morning tea and lunch times have changed. Morning tea will now be 10.30 - 10.50 and lunch 12.30 - 1.10. There will be no healthy snack at 10am. These times will ensure that we can meet our legal obligation to teach 1 hour each of reading, writing and maths each day.

Can you please let Val know in writing / email of any changes to your child's emergency contact or medical details. Please remember to update us if your child now wears glasses, has asthma, hay fever, gluten intolerance or allergies etc.

Buses remain unchanged from 2024. Just a reminder, if you have a morning change please notify the driver before 7.15am. For afternoon changes please phone school. If your child will be off the bus on a regular day, please let Val know.

If your child is absent you need to phone or email school and give a reason. We have to put a reason on the roll for all absences. If we don't have a reason it is recorded as truant. Telling us they are not at school does not give a reason. Attendance is collected each day by the Ministry so all reasons must be entered before the end of the school day.

Stationery is all ready at school for your child. Please send in a pencil case (Huia class) to keep small items safe. Invoices will be sent out shortly.

Transport volunteer forms were sent out home yesterday. Please complete for anyone who may transport children by car on a trip or camp this year. If you need more than one form just let the office know.

Towards the end of February Laura will be travelling to Auckland to undertake 2 days PLD led by Writer's Toolbox. This is the writing program which we began using in Huia class in 2024. It proved to make a real difference for our students so we want to learn more so that we can develop the program further.

During the holiday, Laura and I began completing Structured Literacy PLD with Learning Matters. This will continue for the next 2 terms. This will support us in rolling out a comprehensive phonics and spelling program across school.

Over the next few weeks we will be implementing a new maths program - Maths No Problem. This is one of the programs which the Ministry recommended. Whilst I was in the UK on holiday, I spent a morning at a school observing the program in action in Years 4, 5 and 6. I was very impressed with how enthusiastically the children participated in the lessons and

their level of understanding. Our resources are just arriving and we will begin using the program soon.

This year our Year 7 and 8's are taking part in the William Pike Challenge. This involves them taking part in a variety of tramps and an overnight camp, a passion project and community service. Please contact Laura if you would like more information.

Dental Changes

Alfredton School children will no longer be looked after by Mid-Central Dental Services. They will be looked after by the Wairarapa, but will still go to Eketahuna as before. This is due to the huge backlog in Mid-Central. Please complete the form from the Dental Service and return it to school by Monday 10th February. They are planning to start seeing our children towards the end of term.

Pre-school siblings will need a form completing. These should also be returned to school.

Touch - Friday

Bush Touch Rugby starts on February 14th. Draws will be sent home this week. There has been a huge response and this means there will be 7 fields running at 3.30pm (U7 and U9) and 3 fields (U11 and U13) from 4 to 5.30pm. Games will be 13 minute halves.

There will be a sausage sizzle each week - \$3 sausage and \$2 a drink.

We are on duty on March 7th. This means that we help setting up the fields and putting cones away at the end, as well as timing the games etc. We will be asking for volunteers over the next couple of weeks.

Attendance

The Board is responsible for ensuring that children attend school regularly - at least 90% of the time. This year the Ministry is collecting school attendance data on a daily basis, previously it was collected fortnightly.

Attendance above 80% is in the green band. However, students whose attendance falls between 80 - 89% will be monitored by school. We will inform you of this monitoring.

If attendance falls between 60 - 79% students move into the orange band and whanau will be asked to attend a meeting at school to discuss ways to help the student move into the green band. Outside agencies may be asked for support.

Attendance which falls below 60% will be referred to the attendance officer and an action plan will be put in place. The attendance officer will make a home visit and outside agencies will become involved.

Attendance which falls below 50% (annual attendance) will result in a referral to the police. After 10 school days, if there is no improvement, the school will make a Section 19 referral to Oranga Tamariki for a Family Group Conference.

We have a very small minority of children whose attendance falls into the orange band and no children who are in the red band. It is fantastic to see that so many of our children fall into the green band, with many achieving 90% or higher. Check your child's end of 2024 report to see what their attendance was last year.

If you are concerned about your child's attendance, please let me know if we can help.

Term One Learning

This term our topic focus is local stories. We will be learning the history of Alfredton and the stories of our ancestors (our whakapapa). We will begin using the website Wai Ako each day to improve our understanding of Te Reo and tikanga. Our PE focus is swimming. House of Science will continue to be used to teach science. We will spend time each week on KiVa and continue Navigating our Journey with a focus on growing and changing. We will be focusing on our school values in our weekly assemblies. The first value we will unpack will be integrity. Assembly will take place each Friday starting around 2.20pm. Everyone is welcome to join us.

This term we are introducing a new behaviour rubric. This has our KiVa learning embedded within it and reinforces positive behaviour.
